The Counseling Corner

Throughout the month of October, The Counseling Corner will feature an ongoing weekly discussion of the top 5 emotional difficulties impacting LD children.

LD emotional difficulty number one: **Shame**. For some children, receiving an LD diagnosis can serve as a welcome relief, finally naming the challenges that have plagued them throughout their schooling. For other children, receiving this LD diagnosis can exacerbate their sense of shame, due to an already weakened self-concept and the mystification of what having this label really means. The shame becomes a cycle when LD children do not have the means or permission to discuss the feelings they have about their diagnosis. Both at school and at home, these children should be encouraged to share their frustrations, triumphs and feelings about themselves.

A part of what CAS emphasizes in working with new students is the demystification of their learning difference. We provide modeling and foster open communication about the gifts and challenges that accompany an LD diagnosis. In addition, parents who share an LD diagnosis of their own are in a unique position to discuss their personal strategies for success. Some suggestions to share with your child: Share some of your mistakes and what you learned in the process; Discuss a time when you didn't think you could do something but you persevered anyway, etc. The more you can discuss the feelings and facts that surround your child's LD diagnosis with them, the less shame they will experience. By shifting your child's internalized shame toward external expression, you are releasing them from shame and fostering a healthier self-concept for your LD learner.

Tips to Speed up Morning Drop-Off & Afternoon Pick-Up

- Participate in a carpool if you can! The less cars on campus, the faster traffic flows.
- Try to avoid the morning "crunch" period of 8:10am. So many cars arrive to school in the morning right at 8:10 that traffic backs up on Chula Vista from both directions. If you can arrive at school any time earlier—even as early as 7:45am (no charge for morning daycare after 7:45am) the drop off will move so much quicker!
- Observe the stop signs on Chula Vista, particularly coming up Chula Vista from Alameda. Many cars barely stop before turning right onto Solana and do not allow the cars turning left to actually make their turn. Please drive courteously and observe the stop signs.
- Use your turn signals and turn off your cell phones!
- Have your children ready to exit the car in the morning... backpacks should be at the ready and shoes should be on, so the only thing your child needs to do is hop out of the car!

CAS Art Exhibits

Announcing Charles Armstrong School Student Art Exhibit at San Francisco Airport Museum

October 2009 – November 2009

"Close Up In the Garden"

Eleven works of CAS student art will be exhibited in Concourse A at the Children's Art Exhibition Gallery, located on the lower level of Terminal One. The exhibit dates are October through November 2009.

This exhibit, "Close-Up in the Garden," is a collection of art by second through fifth grade students in art classes taught by Patty Jones and Kristi Martinez at Charles Armstrong School in Belmont, California.

The second and third grade class studied flower paintings of artist Georgia O'Keefe and learned how to use radial symmetry to draw original flower pictures, using photographs of flowers as a reference. Students were taught how to apply color with oil pastels using colors that are close on the color wheel.

The backgrounds were painted with watercolor paint with the oil pastel acting as a resist.

The fourth and fifth grade students studied the work of author and illustrator Eric Carle including the books, "The Very Hungry Caterpillar" and "The Grouchy Ladybug." Carle illustrates his books using tissue paper collage by pre-painting papers and cutting shapes to form images. For this lesson students also studied symmetry and practiced drawing insects. Each student painted a background of tree branches with blossoms on tissue paper which they first mounted on a sturdy paper. Insects were drawn on separate paper and then covered with colored tissue paper and cut out and mounted on the background to complete their composition.

We are in the process of planning a field trip to see the exhibit in October for the students exhibiting. Details will be sent to the families of these students.
